Frequently Asked Questions

- **When does the program start?**
Cohorts begin in the fall of each year.

- **Where will the program be offered?**
The Curriculum and Instruction Program will be offered at two easy-to-reach locations: Atlanta and Macon, with the majority of course work delivered in a hybrid combination, i.e., online and face-to-face.

- **Who may apply?**
Certified educators may apply. There are three initial requirements:
 1. Candidates must hold current certification at the master's level.
 2. Candidates must have three years of successful teaching experience.
 3. Candidates must submit current GRE scores (received within the last six years).
GRE scores are not the sole criteria; applicants are encouraged to apply and will need to provide strong evidence of the ability to complete doctoral courses and independent research in other areas.

- **How long will it take?**
The program will take a minimum of three complete years, or nine semesters, including summers.

- **Can I keep my job and do this program?**
Yes, all classes are offered in the evenings and online during 16-week semesters.

- **How much does it cost?**

Curriculum and Instruction students take an average of two 3-hour courses each semester with one 2-hour doctoral seminar. A few semesters will require three 3-hour courses.

- **Is there financial aid available for this program?**
Generally, loans are available for graduate programs. To receive financial aid, students must be **fully admitted** to the program. Students who are provisionally admitted will not be eligible for aid.
